

WHO IS HERE....

- 58% pre-trial (June 18, 2008)
- 9% pending transport to Dept of Corrections (prison)
- 6% admitted or pending mental health institution admittance
- 27% sentenced
- 14% of total jail population women (May 2, 2008)
- 17% reported homeless or shelter address (January 30, 2008)
- 92% of sentenced male inmates classified as lower-risk (May 2, 2008)
- 62% of pre-trial male inmates classified as lower-risk

SUBSTANCE ABUSE, MENTAL HEALTH & PHYSICAL HEALTH CONCERNS...

- 65% of booked inmates reported using alcohol and/or drugs (Calendar Year 2007)
- 78% of classified inmates reported social, economic and/or legal problems resulted from alcohol and/or drug abuse
- 40% of our prescriptions are for psychotropic medications, equaling 65% of the total costs (July 2008)
- 6% either admitted or pending admission into a state mental hospital, Larned & Osawatomie (June 2008)
- 5% of inmates ID'ed with severe and persistent mental illness (SPMI)
- 24% positive urine analysis while on Work Release (CY 2007)
- 5% positive alcohol breath tests while on Work Release
- 5,025 inmate medical clinic visit
- 278 out-of-facility medical service visits

- Time served 14%

REENTRY TRANSITION PROCESSES

- Sentenced to facility (see eligibility requirements);
- Complete intake assessment;
- Refer to available programs, including Job Readiness workshops;
- Apply for Inmate Worker Program;
- Utilize in-house job search activities and other programs;
- Job search in- and out-of-facility;
- Transition into work release;
- Complete reentry release plan to the community.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Sentenced time to serve at sentencing or as probation violation sanction;
- No Level III disciplinary write-ups for a minimum of 2 weeks, Level II write-ups reviewed on individual basis;
- No administrative segregation or disciplinary segregation classification;
- No detainers to a state or federal correctional facility; and
- Returning to the Douglas County area upon release.
